SUBJECT MATTER OF THE CASE

The application concerns the administrative removal of the applicant, an HIV-positive openly gay man, to Uzbekistan where he would allegedly face the real risk of treatment contrary to Article 3 of the Convention in the light of the criminal prohibition of consensual sexual intercourse between men in that country.

QUESTIONS

1. Would the applicant face a real risk of being subjected to treatment contrary to Article 3 of the Convention in the event of his removal to Uzbekistan in view of the current criminal prohibition of consensual sexual intercourse between men in that country? (see *F.G. v. Sweden* [GC], no. 43611/11, §§ 112-16, 23 March 2016, *J.K. and Others v. Sweden* [GC], no. 59166/12, § 91, 23 August 2016, and *I.K. v. Switzerland* (dec.), no. 21417/17, §§ 24, 27, 19 December 2017).
